

## Scheme of Work Conversation Classes (CL3)

Course Length: 48 Lessons Lesson Length: 100 minutes

Course Aims: (adapted from the CEFR 'Can do' statements for B1 Level)

By the end of the course students will be able to

- Deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken.
- Enter unprepared into conversation on topics that are familiar, of personal interest or pertinent to everyday life (e.g. family, hobbies, work, travel and current events).
- Connect phrases in a simple way in order to describe experiences and events, my dreams, hopes & ambitions.
- Briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
- Narrate a story or relate the plot of a book or film and describe my reaction
- Initiate, maintain and close simple face-to-face conversation on topics that are familiar or of personal interest.
- Keep going comprehensibly, even though pausing for grammatical and lexical planning and repair is very evident, especially in longer stretches of free production.
